

### Arecibo Waste-to-Energy and Resource Recovery Project

Energy Answers Arecibo, LLC's (Energy Answers) proposes to construct and operate a new WTE and resource recovery project at the site of the former Global Fibers Paper Mill in Arecibo, in the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico (hereinafter referred to as the Arecibo WTE Project or Project).

RUS, an agency within the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA), has issued a Draft EIS for Energy Answers proposed Waste to Energy Project in Arecibo, Puerto Rico. RUS issued the Draft EIS to inform interested parties and the general public about the proposed Project and to invite the public to comment on the scope, proposed action, and other issues addressed in the Draft EIS. The Draft EIS addresses the construction, operation, and maintenance of Energy Answers' proposed project.

**Financing for Arecibo Waste to Energy Generation and Resource Recovery  
Facility Arecibo, Puerto Rico**

Dear Ms. Strenght:

The Municipality of Guaynabo, (hereinafter, the Municipality), owner of the Guaynabo Municipal Solid Waste Landfill most respectfully wants to take this opportunity to express its deep concern for the lack of thoroughness which most regulatory agencies, both local and federal, have proceeded regarding the evaluation of the environmental, social and economic impact of a project of such magnitude as the one proposed by Energy Answers Arecibo, LLC. One of the needs is to review the Environmental Impact Statement (EIS), analyze to ascertain the total absence of a rigorous and objective analysis, not only to the noticeable environmental and public health impact, but also to the economic prospect of the Municipalities that are "bound" to disregard and disrupt their own MSW established programs, in lieu of an imposed more onerous alternative.

It is pertinent to mention that in recent years our Municipality have been the recipients of the US Environmental Protection Agency's ("EPA") and the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico's Environmental Quality Board ("EQB") requiring capital improvements to the Guaynabo Municipal Solid Waste Landfill well beyond those required by law, something that has not occurred with the



rigor and severity at any other adjacent landfill. These actions have entailed considerable resources expenditure in the design, construction and operation of environmental control systems, capital improvement that go well beyond those required by regulation and the implementation of a comprehensive curbside collection of recyclables programs, this later being an element contrary to Energy Answers' incinerator proposal which assumes a very low rate of recycling collection and disposition.

It is essential to reiterate that the economic impact that such a project will have in the region must be thoroughly examined. Energy Answers of Arecibo, LLC's proposed incinerator, will have a devastating economic impact in the Municipalities that will be ultimately forced to dispose their solid waste in their facilities to guarantee the incinerator's required gigantic waste consumption. This is mainly due to the fact that 2,100 tons per day facility will require a substantial waste supply to cover their normal operating costs, not to mention the substantial amount needed to cover the return on investment on well over 500 million dollars expenditure.

Consequently, such business model will rendered totally inconsequential and ineffective any serious recycling effort. The massive amount of waste received at the facility without presumably any effective pre-sorting system shall inevitably incinerate a vast amount of valuable recyclable resources such as paper, cardboard, wood and plastics, all of which contain a high caloric value. This is in direct opposition to the stated public policy of both US EPA and the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico's EQB, which have declared their commitment in the promotion and expansion of collection of recyclables material programs, both at the state and the municipal level.

Another flawed assumption that the Energy Answers of Arecibo, LLC's proposed incinerator Environmental Impact Statement rested was in the sense that the population of the island was constantly growing. The objective fact is that Puerto Rico has experienced a considerable decrease in population. This decrease in population will be translated in a substantial increment in the Municipalities that will be forced to dispose their solid waste at the incinerator, thereby aggravating the economic outlook of an ever increasing amount of Municipalities.

In summary, this project is contrary to the stated public policy of both US EPA and the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico's EQB in terms of their commitment to

expand recycling programs. The extreme economic effects in the Municipalities forced to dispose their solid waste at the incinerator has been overlooked and not properly considered. Also, the "softness" of the regulating agencies in their review and approval of Energy Answers of Arecibo, LLC's permits process has not created a "*leveled playing field*" with other waste disposal facilities including Landfills, Transfer Stations and Recyclable Material Processing Centers.

The Municipality of Guaynabo, in order to preserve the wide and explicit mandate for Municipal Autonomy vested upon our Municipalities by Public Law 81 of the 30<sup>th</sup> of August 1991, know as the Autonomous Municipalities Law, shall pursue all courses of action, including but no limited to a judicial challenge of the standing contractual relationship between Energy Answers of Arecibo, LLC's and the Puerto Rico Solid Waste Management Authority and/or any attempt to enforce upon us the same.

Though I filed several motions, that last one motion was not ruled upon and remains pending.

The EPA PSD permit lacks proper consent of the Fish and Wildlife Service which violated its operating procedures by issuing consent in the absence of description of the cooling water intake and ash disposal. Those two related activities were not described at the time of permit solicitation.

Moreover the Wind dispersion model became obsolete because of the massive ground cover replacement from vegetative to concrete and asphalt that occurred on the North corridor upon the installation of the Super Aqueduct within the 20 years from the Energy Answers data collection. This fact was raised by Martha Quinones when she challenged the use of NOAA wind data from San Juan, Aguadilla and ST Thomas airports excluding from the record the Arecibo Airport NOAA data. Kathie Stein corruptively charged that the Arecibo NOAA data was not part of the NOAA collection and thus was unavailable to the EPA.

The EPA record clearly shows the series of absurdities Kathie Stein had to fabricate in order to keep the support of the other two judges of the Board. The sole reason for refusing to officially receive my still pending motion was simply because Kathie Stein lost support from the other two judges.

I hope this information helps the USDA protect US taxpayers money until Energy Answers secures a proper PSD permit.

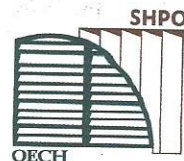

We have reviewed the draft Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) prepared for the above referenced project. In our review, we concentrated on compliance with 54 U.S.C. 306108 (commonly known as Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act) and the potential effects that implementation of the undertaking may have on historic properties. The draft EIS defines the area of potential effects (APE, the geographic area or areas within which an undertaking may directly or indirectly affect historic properties) of this project as the waste to energy generation plant (78.9 acres) and the transmission routes for water and electricity (3,100 and 850 linear meters, respectively). It is not clear from the document, though, whether any new access roads or work staging areas would be needed for this project and where they would be located. If any of these are to be placed outside the boundaries of the plant property or the linear right-of-way of the transmission lines, then the APE should be expanded to cover these other project areas, which may require additional identification efforts for historic properties.

As stated in the draft EIS, two archaeological reconnaissance surveys were carried out for this project in the defined APE, one for the plant location and a second for the transmission lines. These were reviewed by our Office in 2010. No historic properties were identified. Nevertheless, section 3.9.6 (Effects Analysis) of the draft EIS should be revised to reflect that if historic properties are discovered or unanticipated effects on historic properties found during implementation of this undertaking (not just the discovery of human remains) after Rural Development has completed the Section 106 process, this would trigger the post-review discovery procedures found in 36 CFR 800.13.





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More comments:

The EIS draft states that the sites in Guaynabo and Guayama sites were rejected because of higher transportation costs. This statement is one of convenience to the proponent. It does not trump the fact that those sites are not on wetlands. Thus it is evident that other feasible sites are available which are not wetlands. Therefore USDA is forbidden to assist the proposal.

The technology assessment does not evaluate Anaerobic Digestion in place of incineration. Thus it is evident that other technologies are available to alleviate the landfills congestion problem. Incineration provides no discernible advantage. Except in the non disclosed case of solving the affluent population's Automotive Shredding Refuse disposal problem.

Moreover it is not a requirement of the incinerator technology to be placed within a wetland. Thus the proposed technology itself does not justify building over a wetland. This is important because the regulation allows USDA assistance to construction over a wetland in cases where technology requires such action. This under the rationale that the technological benefits out weight the harm on wetlands. In fact the technological discourse in the EIS is totally irrelevant as it does not address its purpose of justifying the wetland intrusion.

The landfill congestion problem is not well defined. The proposal does not list the municipalities that will be served by the project. It has been said in local media that municipalities in the south and east sides of the Island will be contractually binded to supply its municipal waste to the incineration operation. This is important because the proponent put forward the transportation costs as excuse to reject the non wetland sites in Guayama and Guaynabo. If the scope of service includes all the municipalities in Puerto Rico for the 50 years duration of service, the proposed sites of Guayama and Guaynabo are as good as any. On the other hand if the scope of service within the 50 years only includes the municipalities in the northern and west sides of the Island, it must be disclosed as requirement to building over a wetland so that municipalities not served can rest assure that Anaerobic Digestion and recycling are viable options after commencement of incineration operations.

The Automotive Shredding Refuse disposal problem is not even disclosed. The municipalities that will supply the chlorine rich Automotive Shredding Refuse are not disclosed either. If not required as part of the problem solving process, it is required under the Environmental Justice Executive Order as comparative disclosure of affluent beneficiary populations and project scope.

The project does not expound the "solution" to the "energy problem". It does not explain how does Puerto Rico need 80 Megawatts of production capacity. It does not address recent migration patterns where families are abandoning their home for better lives stateside; thus lowering energy consumption rates. It does not address the perceived excess capacity in the current PREPA operation. It does not explain the possible lowering of energy rates; if any.

The proposal does not disclose the characterization of the municipal waste as to identify

biogenic versus non biogenic waste (plastic vs food). Particularly because the proponent seeks credit for biogenic CO2 emissions by assuming all the municipal waste is "renewable" non fossil material. The proponent seeks to be labeled as "renewable" energy when more than half the materials to be combusted are fossil fuel products chlorine rich plastics. This goes back to the limits of the proposed technology of incineration which by its nature cannot combust solely renewable waste streams. Thus Anaerobic Digestion is a superior technology capable of processing all renewable waste streams without the addition of fossil fuel derived plastics. Thus there is no technological advantage to the proposed technology. Much less an advantage that justifies construction over a wetland. It is important to disclose the characterization of the municipal waste stream so that the public can comment on the economic feasibility and hardships to be imposed upon the served municipalities. As to operational requirements of volume and quality of waste streams.

### 2.1.1 Site Selection /wetland

I find it appalling the assertion that there is no single site in the whole island that would host an incinerator without interfering with a wetland. I find it insufficient to assert a claim that 33 sites were considered and none away from a wetland. I am sure that there are hundreds of suitable sites away from wetlands and that there should be some also out of a flood plain. Please disclose the alleged list of 33 potential sites.

Sites may be inconvenient to Energy Answers for political reasons, but the availability of suitable alternative in Salinas, or Cayey, or Coamo to name a few make assistance by the USDA illegal.

### 3.2.2.2

#### Surface Water

I must admit that the Vigia pump is indeed described for the first time in the EIS. I did not find such description within the USEPA PSD permit. I find the water intake description shallow. It states that the Vigia pump exhausts a minimum of 30 million gallons per day, every day, every year. It does not provide records of daily usage or computer modeling of service. It does not provide analysis of water quality or operations water quality requirements. My concern is that the Vigia pump has never been used as a daily intake system. That its purpose is flood control and not water intake. Re-purposing the Vigia pump for Energy Answers needs has to be investigated more thoroughly. There is not an analysis of the possibility of salt water intrusion into the endangered species habitat at Cano Tiburones due to fresh water extraction. Though diverting 2.6 from an alleged 30 million gallons effluent sounds proper, I find the allegation of minimum 30mgd effluent non substantiated. Cano Tiburones is an estuary. Its interaction with ocean waters is both above and below ground. If fresh water is unduly removed from the system salt water will intrude below ground.

The Fish and Wildlife Service assessment, much like the USEPA assessment cannot be relied upon as they are not soundly footed in law. Particularly because the water intake at El Vigia pump was never described during the USEPA PSD permit process. And the USEPA corruptly refused to include the Arecibo airport NOAA data in its air quality validation assessment.

### 3.3.1.8

#### Global Climate Change

The EIS fails to assert that the proposed incinerator will emit 1 megaton of CO<sub>2</sub> per year and proposes no quantification nor mitigation contrary to CEQ2014 threshold of 25 kilotons of CO<sub>2</sub>.

### 3.3.2.2

#### Inventory of Emissions

The EIS fails to include CO2 and dioxins emissions in the inventory.

#### Green House Gases

The EIS makes an illusion of arithmetic that purports to claim that the incinerator will actually sequester CO2 emissions rather than emit 1 megaton of CO2. This absurdity was rejected by the court when it declared null the USEPA moratory on biogenic CO2 emissions regulation. The planet does not care whether the CO2 were avoided at an imaginary location. CO2's are emitted at a rate of 1 megaton per year and it should be mitigated because the technology allows it and the policy dictates it.

Nevertheless the "credit" analysis fails to incorporate the displaced solar cells that will not be installed because federal funding at the tune of \$700 million are diverted from solar cells 50% rebate subsidy to the incinerator. It does not identify the oil fired 700 kilotons avoided at an imaginary power plant. No oil fired power plant will shut down during the operation of the incinerator since Puerto Rico now has overcapacity due to the migration and economic stagnation. It also fails to incorporate the possible establishment of methane digestion technology which may control the other estimated 1.3 megatons of CO2 emissions.

The rationale to moot the Environmental Justice is flawed as it falsely identifies the ROI as an homogeneous by limiting its coverage to the site's geographical location without the inclusion of the operation's full geographical impact.

I assert that a Waste Incineration operation impact not only the immediate vicinity of the plant but the far reached suppliers of waste. Any Environmental Justice assessment must include the fees to be charged to all affected populations and the environmental benefits, constraints and hardships that would be imposed on all populations.

The Energy Answers incinerator proposes to burn Automotive Shredding Refuse. Such plastics burning will benefit the populations that currently have to endure such hazardous plastics accumulate in their vicinity by removing mounts of shredded plastics to Puerto Rico once the incinerator becomes operational. The Energy Answers operation also requires the payment of fees by municipalities that would be contractually forced to forgo local reuse and recycling of municipal waste in order to feed the massive incinerator operation.

The Environmental Justice policy is in essence a policy against "not in my backyard discrimination". Thus the proponent will artfully trump the spirit of the policy by refusing to account for all affected populations. Therefore, the only way to comply with the Environmental Justice policy is to disclose and describe all affected populations. The Draft EIS fails to include in its analysis all the municipalities that will be benefited and constrained

in their environmental actions range; both in Puerto Rico and California. The EIS must disclose the contractual terms binding the environmental actions of the municipalities in Puerto Rico. The EIS must also disclose the sources of non municipal waste that it will incinerate; particularly the Automotive Shredding Refuse. Once the full Region of Impact is identifies a sound Environmental Justice assessment can be disclosed. This rationale is consistent with the employment assessment later in the EIS that include San Juan as a possible source of labor.

There is no environmental justice disclosure related to CO2 emissions.

### 3.11.2.2 Page 3- 132 Protection of Children

The proposed incinerator will burn Automotive Shredding Refuse, basically high calories plastics. Such burning of Chlorine rich plastics creates dioxins that are health hazards to children. No such disclosure is included in the EIS at page 3-132. Please review the attached study of a similar plant in Germany where it admits that 8% of the dioxins will be exhausted to the vicinity.

### 4.1.1 page 4-1 Air Quality

There is no disclosure in the EIS of CO2 emissions. There is no disclosure of Best of Available Containment Technology for CO2 emissions.

The Air Quality Modeling presented to the EPA is not valid and was never validated against current NOAA wind data at the Arecibo Airport. The data was gathered in 1993 and purported to be validated using Aguadilla, San Juan and St Thomas airports NOAA data excluding the Arecibo Airport data. The USEPA falsely asserted that the best available data indicated that wind current patterns do not change in the Caribbean. In order to validate such assertion the Arecibo Airport data was corruptedly excluded from the analysis. Furthermore the passage of time since the 1993 data allowed for the development of the superaqueduct and the massive urbanization of the northern corridor that has replaced the 1993 vegetative ground cover with massive pavement and cement ground cover that creates convection currents that differ from the 1993 air quality modeling data.

USEPA regulation mandates that whenever possible an environmental analysis must include available data that is closest to the site under scrutiny. Thus the exclusion of Arecibo Airport data was corrupted and against regulation.

The Northern Corridor is a series of municipalities around Arecibo that now hold two thirds of the Puerto Rico Population.

The Super Aqueduct is a 1994 massive aqueducts construction project that connects the Northern Corridor water Reservoirs to the San Juan Metroplex.
